**Specialty Shop: Lucy and Company**

Lucy and Company is known for its use of bold, graphic textures and colors in kids' spaces. Trina Cone wanted a bright and fun nursery for her second child and knew the Dilworth studio would be up to the task of transforming her home's guest bedroom into a striking room for her baby boy Wortham, due in November.

Cone loved blues, greens and browns and set Lucy & Company interior designer Caitlyn Miller to work with that palette in mind. "Those colors coordinate with the rest of her house, but she also wanted to make sure the room had its own personality," Miller says.

Cone already had a lovely brown crib, which had belonged to her now-2-year-old daughter Darden. "We custom-design all our bedding, so with a new skirt and bumper, we gave the crib a whole new look," Miller says.

The focal point of the room? The playful turquoise, blue and brown irregular circles painted on the walls surrounding the crib. Painted by Lucy and Company staff artists Matt Zales and Sam Staszak, the circles are a replica of a design in one of the fabrics Miller and Cone selected for part of the crib bedding and throw pillows. Miller says, "The walls make a huge statement and really tie in all of the room's design elements."

Miller notes that one surprise element she took advantage of was an odd part of the wall that juts out in order to make room for a staircase on the other side. "I saw it as the perfect reading nook, so we made a bench seat and back pillows. Trina's white hanging bookshelf completed the look and now Wortham will have a comfy spot to curl up and read in when he gets a bit older!"

No nursery is complete without a rocker and ottoman for parents to settle into with their baby. Miller chose a blue corduroy to compliment the fabric and walls. And for the room's finishing touches, she dressed up some custom lamps with a small brown pom-pom trim and selected canvas artwork featuring two baby monkeys to hang over the dresser. The end result, Miller says, is a nursery that's "cozy and inviting and definitely has its own personality!" ●
